Dear Mr. Rosebraugh:

This letter is supplied to a witness scheduled to appear before the federal grand jury in order to provide helpful background information about the grand jury. The grand jury consists of from 16 to 23 persons from the District of Oregon. It is their responsibility to inquire into federal crimes which may have been committed in this district.

As a grand jury witness, you will be asked to testify and answer questions. The grand jury may request that you produce records and documents. Only the members of the grand jury, attorneys for the United States and a stenographer are permitted in the grand jury room while you testify.

We advise you that the grand jury is conducting an investigation of possible violations of federal criminal laws involving, but not necessarily limited to, arson, use of fire or explosives to destroy U.S. property, interference with interstate commerce by means of violence, interstate travel in aid of racketeering, animal enterprise terrorism, conspiracy, and aiding and abetting in criminal activity. You are advised that the destruction or alteration of any document required to be produced before the grand jury constitutes serious violation of federal law, including but not limited to obstruction of justice.

You are advised that you are a target of the grand jury's investigation. You may refuse to answer any question if a truthful answer to the question would tend to incriminate you. Anything that you do or say may be used against you in a subsequent legal proceeding. If you have retained counsel who represents you personally, the grand jury will permit you a reasonable opportunity to step outside the grand jury room and confer with counsel if you desire.

As you know from the subpoena served on you on February 2, 2000, you are required to appear before the grand jury on Tuesday, February 29, 2000, at 11:30 a.m. Should you fail to appear before the grand jury, you may be subject to an arrest warrant and an order to show cause why you should not be held in contempt.
