ORDER COMPELLING TESTIMONY
PURSUANT TO 18 U.S.C. §§ 6001-6003 and
28 C.F.R. §§ 0.175-0.178

This matter came before the court on motion of the United States Attorney for the District of Oregon filed on February 25, 2000. It appears to the satisfaction of the court that:

(1) CRAIG SCOTT ROSEBRAUGH has been called to testify before the grand jury in this District in its investigation of the arson alleged to have occurred on or about December 25, 1999, in Monmouth, Oregon, at the offices of the Boise Cascade Corporation;

(2) In the judgment of the United States Attorney, CRAIG SCOTT ROSEBRAUGH is likely to refuse to testify or provide other information on the basis of his privilege against self-incrimination;


(3) In the judgment of the United States Attorney, the testimony or other information from CRAIG SCOTT ROSEBRAUGH may be necessary to the public interest;

(4) The aforesaid motion filed by the United States Attorney has been made with the approval of Deputy Assistant Attorney General Mary Lee Warren of the Criminal Division of the U.S. Department of Justice, pursuant to the authority vested in her by Title 18, United States Code, Section 6003, and 28 C.F.R. § 0.175.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Sections 6002-6003, that CRAIG SCOTT ROSEBRAUGH shall give testimony or provide other information which he refuses to give or to provide on the basis of his privilege against self-incrimination at the grand jury investigation of the alleged arson that occurred on or about December 25, 1999, in Monmouth, Oregon, at the offices of the Boise Cascade Corporation.

This order shall become effective only if after the date of this order CRAIG SCOTT ROSEBRAUGH refuses to testify or provide other information on the basis of his privilege against self-incrimination.


